

This handout is intended to outline some of the initial information you need to know to help your child settle into Nursery.

We are very excited to get to know you and your children and to be working together over the next year.

How I can support my child



As the term progresses we will send out information on what the children have been learning and some simple things that you can do at home. These will mainly be short practical activities for you to do together. The most effective ways of supporting your child during their time in Nursery is to teach your child to use the toilet independently, read lots of stories with them and to encourage your child to talk lots.

Behaviour



In order for all to achieve their potential we are committed to creating an environment where exemplary behaviour is at the heart of productive learning, thus enabling all to feel secure and respected. We do this by having clear and simple rules which are explicitly taught and modeled by all members of our school community. Our three school rules are:

- Be ready - Be respectful - Be safe

We also have four listening skills that we actively teach across school. These are:

- Good listening is...sitting still
- Good listening is...staying quiet
- Good listening is...looking at the person who is talking
- Good listening is...listening to all of the words
