#### **Home Learning Policy**

At Belle Vue Primary School, we recognise that pupils who have spent a busy structured day at school need time to relax and unwind at the end of the afternoon and have an opportunity to be children. We are also mindful of the need to encourage children to pursue out-of-school activities, e.g., swimming, dance, Beavers, Brownies, music lessons etc.

We believe that homework activities can help enrich our pupils' learning but should not promote resentment, friction and conflict. Homework should be used to effectively to help support and further develop the skills and knowledge learnt in the classroom. Expectations around the nature of the homework and its outcomes should always be age appropriate. Our approach to homework reflects these beliefs.

In Key Stage 1 and Key Stage 2, we follow a SMART approach to homework (see infographic attached). The approach across school focuses on the skills of reading, spelling and maths (with a focus on multiplication in Year 2 and Key Stage 2) and is an inclusive approach that means all of our pupils, including those with SEND, can access and engage with any homework set.

In Key Stage 2, in addition to the key skills homework activities, which children should complete daily/weekly at home, we set a half-termly task that will allow children to reflect on and showcase their learning from a specific curriculum focus.

As a school, we know that our parents are valuable partners in the education of our pupils and we know that you will be keen to support your child and our staff, by being actively involved with homework activities.

To avoid 'battles' over homework we recommend: -

- that children should be allowed to work at an appropriate pace
- acknowledgement should be given to their own interests
- the task is undertaken at an appropriate time when the child is best able to concentrate (try not to leave it to the last minute)
- your child may need lots of encouragement, praise and your company and help for certain tasks
- that work at home is perceived as a shared activity
- work at home should be planned carefully around other interests to avoid clashes
- it should not be used as a threat or punishment.

Although there will be no formal consequences for those children that do not complete homework, it is our expectation that ALL children will attempt any activities that are set. However, should your child find that they are unable to complete an activity due to a lack of understanding, please contact your child's class teacher for further support and guidance.
