


We want our children to establish firm roots, equipping them with the knowledge, skills and understanding to be positive, contributing, members of our global society.














- We operate an open door policy to enable you to have access to school staff to answer questions that may arise throughout the school week.
- At different times throughout the year children will be sent home with information packs and take home challenges to consolidate learning.

What is the best way to help my child succeed?

- 23% of children who struggled with language at the age of five did not reach the expected level in English at the end of Key Stage 2.
- 96% of children who had good language skills at the age of five reached the expected level in English at the end of Key Stage 2.
- 21% of children who struggled with language at the age of five did not reach the expected level in Maths at the end of Key Stage 2.
- 98% of children who had good language skills at the age of five reached the expected level in Maths at the end of Key Stage 2.
- Children with poor vocabulary aged five amore than twice as likely to be unemployed at aged 34 as children with a good vocabulary.

Talk, talk, talk!!!!!

What is the best way to help my child succeed?

- Read to your child sign them up to the library and join events there over the summer. (A longitudinal study commissioned by the Department for Education found that children who owned more books and were taken to the library more frequently at age two achieved higher scores in language and communication when entering primary school, Roulstone et al 2010).
- Talk to your child introduce new words (Vocabulary ability at the age
 of five is strongly associated with comprehension skills at age 11,
 Finnegan et al 2015; Axford and Albers 2018)
- Label your child's feelings- (Early language acquisition contributes to children's ability to manage emotions and communicate feelings, to establish relationships and to think symbolically (Law et al 2017; Pordes Bowers et al 2012).

Setting Visits

The majority of children new to Belle Vue have now had a setting visit from Mrs Richardson. Where this is not possible the settings key person will be contacted by phone.

Children attending Belle Vue Nursery will have the opportunity to visit Reception during the remainder of this term with shared times outdoors planed.

Stay and Play Sessions

On Wednesday 6th
September we will be running a stay and play session for you and your child to attend. This will be an opportunity for you to meet the staff and you may be provided with additional paperwork e.g. collection passwords.

Home Visits

Home visits will take place on the afternoons of the 6th, 7th and 8th September. The aim of home visits is for you to share information that you would like us to know about your child that will support their journey into Reception. It is also an opportunity for you to get to know the staff one to one. Visits will be approx. 15/20 minutes.
