As a child, and growing up, I never fit in, I always felt the odd one out, I had few friendship groups, but never felt I clicked into place with any of them. I was a very anxious child and could not cope if teachers shouted, or things in school changed.

After school, I started college, which was a disaster, and I ended up in a deep depression, seeing my peers getting jobs on the side and I was struggling to keep up with the workload and the social expectations. I ended up dropping out and getting a job. I was put on antidepressants, which took the edge off my depression and anxiety, but a lot of things that were easy for everyone else were such hard work for me, and would leave me exhausted and burnt out.

With the rise of social media, I found it much easier to make and keep friends online, as there comes little social expectations from this, and I can stay in my home, my safe place. It was one of these friends who suggested I perhaps am autistic. How I laughed at this.

I did then start reading a little more about autism, and a lot of things made sense to me. But still, I couldn't be autistic, could I?

After another medication change, I bought it up with my GP that I thought we might just be treating symptoms of something else, rather than "just" depression and anxiety and she agreed, and I tentatively mentioned autism, and she said she didn't know why she hadn't thought of that before, and it made complete sense to her.

I have recently been diagnosed with ADHD, and am awaiting an official autism diagnosis, the waiting lists have been long, but it feels better to have answers, and to now be more aware of things, and I'm also learning to be more gentle with myself, and know that I'll need time to recover after large social events, and I'm slowly finding my people in real life who I can be my genuine self around, without having to wear the social mask.

All children need to have a pair of pumps and trainers in school, as it is not safe for children to be doing PE in their school shoes. Unless their kit is dirty or wet please can we keep kits in school.

Indoor and outdoor kit needs to be in school every week as we will be doing as much PE outside as we can. Children are also able to wear coats, gloves, hats, snoods or scarfs if this wish too. It is essential that all children have trainers to wear outdoors as school shoes are not permitted and pumps are not ideal.

- * Indoor PE kit: white t-shirt, red short and pumps.
- * Outdoor PE kit: Black/Navy or Grey joggers, hoodie or jacket, white t-shirt and trainers.

If they attend after school clubs and go home in their PE kits please ensure PE kits are returned.

Year 6 PE days – Monday morning, Thursday morning
















